Information For Schools

1. Schools will distribute the following materials to school leavers who qualify for ITE (to be collected with the results slips) on results release day:

- a) 1 copy of Form N
- b) 1 copy of ITE's Admission Booklet with scholarship brochure inserted
- c) 1 copy of ITE's Traineeship brochure

2. Additional materials for N(T) School Leavers with 0 or 1 Pass

- a) 1 copy of e-NFP Invitation Letter for school leaver (addressed to student)
- b) 1 copy of e-NFP Invitation Letter for parent/guardian (in multiple languages)

3. Teachers can use the information to guide students through the application process. Schools can further customise the slides to best serve their students' needs.

4. Although these materials provide complete instructions for the JIE enrolment process, our N(A) and N(T) students may require clearer guidance to navigate the application system. We strongly encourage schools to allocate computer labs and direct students to these labs so that teachers can guide them through the application process.

Information for Schools

5. N(T) students with 0 or 1 pass can additionally opt for the e-NFP (3-Year *Nitec* Course) in ITE. When these students are directed to the computer lab, we request that schools pay particular attention that they also go through the JIE 'E' application process for the 3-Year *Nitec* course (see slides 9-10) in addition to the JIE 'N' application process for the 2-Year *Nitec* course (see slides 7-8).

Key Pointers for Students on ITE's Joint Intake Exercise (JIE) for Admission to *Nitec* Courses

Secondary



8 things you should know



ITE

All N(T) students and N(A) students (who are not progressing to 5N(A) or repeating 4N(A)) are eligible for JIE.

Keen competition for *Nitec* courses, so use all 12 choices!

Participation in Main Phase is key to secure a place in ITE!

If you are applying for Traineeship, make sure you apply in Main Phase to avoid missing a place!

If you are unsuccessful in EAE, make sure you apply in Main Phase to avoid missing a place!

If you have received an additional letter, then you are eligible for the 3-year *Nitec* Programme (eNFP).

If you are eligible for eNFP, make sure you apply for the 2-year *Nitec* first before applying for eNFP!

Additional eNFP year helps to improve literacy and numeracy skills!

Information for Secondary School Teachers:

Support for N(A)*/N(T) School Leavers who Did not Apply after Main Phase Application [23 Dec 2019]

- All N(A)*/N(T) school leavers are encouraged to put in an application during the **1st Phase (Main Phase)** between **19 Dec 2019 (2.30pm) to 23 Dec 2019 (5pm)**.
- Secondary School Teachers will contact N(A)*/N(T) school leavers who did not apply during the 1st Phase (Main Phase) to
 - Remind/Encourage them to apply **online** during the **2nd Phase (Late Application/Appeal Phase)** between **3 Jan 2020 to 7 Jan 2020**.
- Their application results for 2nd Phase (Late Application/Appeal Phase) will be known on **15 Jan at 9am**.
- Unsuccessful applicants can appeal under the **3rd Phase (Final Top-up Phase)** between **15 Jan to 23 Jan 2020 and 29 Jan to 10 Feb 2020** for courses with vacancies.
